## GENERAL INFORMATION

This service is provided by the Department for Education and Child Development for all children in the community aged from 0-5 years.

The program is based on the Early Years Learning Framework for Australia - Belonging Being and Becoming

Governance of the play centre program is the joint responsibility of the Play centre Management Committee or School Governing Council and the nominated line manager



Children aged 0-3 years must be accompanied by an adult. Children aged 3-5 years may be left with the Play Centre Leader for all or part of the day, however the required adult: child ratio for children over 3 years of age is a minimum of one adult to five children, in addition to the play centre leader. A roster system for parents and carers will be developed to provide this support and supervision.
